### Dear President Young:

We, the undersigned members of UAW Local 4121, are Academic Student Employees (ASE) from 100 departments and hiring units across three campuses. On April 5, 2012 ASEs came out in force to communicate to the Board of Regents some of our gravest concerns about the University's budget. We're following up with a letter to urge you to take action.

As a key workforce that performs frontline research and instructional work and helps generate substantial revenue to make the UW a world-class institution, we're given significant responsibility to ensure that quality and access are maintained, especially during these tough economic times. Investing in our work ensures the University's capacity to teach, to innovate, and to provide services to the community that put these innovations into practice.

To be sure, the state has in recent years failed in its obligation to fund higher education. Our union has taken action to change this by lobbying with you against cuts, and address the fundamental injustice of an economic system that allows certain entities to profit while core services like UW get slashed. We think these efforts have paid off, and are heartened that the legislature has protected higher education funding and enacted progressive revenue measures this year.

But we are speaking out because we believe the University needs to do its part to ensure that its policymaking and budget allows us to maintain quality and keep pace with our peer institutions. In contract negotiations our bargaining committee has made proposals - ratified overwhelmingly by Local 4121 members - to maintain quality, access, and competitiveness by addressing compensation and standards of living; health and welfare; family-friendly benefits; and academic quality in our collective bargaining agreement.

We urge you to demonstrate strong leadership by settling a contract that includes fee waivers, fair benefits, and a commitment to maintain academic excellence. It is through investing in critical workforces like ours that UW will secure its standing as a first-rate institution.
